# PROGRAM OVERVIEW



- The NYPD Leadership/In-service Program at John Jay College is designed to provide educational opportunities to active and retired Uniform Members of the Service (UMOS) of the:
  - ✦ City of New York Department of Corrections (DOC)
  - ✦ New York City Fire Department (FDNY)
  - ✦ New York City Police Department (NYPD)

# NYPD LEADERSHIP PROGRAM



- Scholarship for undergraduate and graduate active NYPD police officers and supervisors
- The scholarship covers the following for four classes (12 credits total):
  - ✦ Tuition
  - ✦ Technology fees
  - ✦ Textbook costs
- Courses are conducted during the fall and spring semesters at John Jay College, on Fridays **only**

# NYPD/IN-SERVICE PROGRAM



- Exemption from admission criteria
- Earn credits for basic academy training:
  - ✦ Up to 29 for NYPD
  - ✦ Up to 18 for DOC
  - ✦ Up to 10 for FDNY
- Additional credits:
  - ✦ 68 from a community college
  - ✦ 90 from a senior college

*\*Cannot exceed 90 credits from all sources*
- Exemption from General Education Requirements when earning 28 liberal art credits
- Individualized counseling

# BACHELOR DEGREE STUDENTS



- Admission to a Bachelor's degree program at John Jay College (JJC)
- Student's in the Leadership Program may register for courses outside the program at any time

# FINANCIAL BENEFITS



- **One-Course Tuition Waiver (a.k.a Pataki Waiver) (NYPD):**

- ✦ **Description:** Using this tuition waiver will allow students to have their tuition waived for **one** course outside the NYPD Leadership Program. Students using the tuition waiver, are only responsible for paying the technology fees. Students may use this **one** time only
- ✦ **Eligibility:** **Active** NYPD police officer ranking

- **Tuition Deduction (NYPD/In-service):**

- ✦ **Description:** \$100 tuition deduction for courses outside the program, per semester
- ✦ **Eligibility:** Available to active, non-supervisory students **ONLY**

# GRADUATE NON-DEGREE



- Earn graduate-level credits
- May enroll in graduate degree program



# APPLY CREDITS TO DEGREE



- MA Criminal Justice (Online & On Campus) - 12 credits
- MPA (Online & On Campus) - 12 credits
- MS Emergency Management - 9 credits
- MS Protection Management - 12 credits
- MS Security Management (Online) - 9 credits
- MA Forensic Mental Health Counseling & Forensic Psychology – 6 credits
- MA International Crime and Justice – 3 credits

# FINANCIAL BENEFITS



- **One-Course Tuition Waiver (a.k.a Pataki Waiver):**

- ✦ **Description:** Students may use this for any course outside the NYPD Leadership Program. You may use this **one** time only. If you used the tuition waiver as an undergraduate student, you are not eligible to use this a second time
- ✦ **Eligibility:** Students must be matriculated in a graduate program **AND** a police officer ranking
