

Donal E.J. MacNamara Award Recipients 2011

David Green, Assistant Professor, in Sociology arrived at John Jay College in January 2008. He received his Ph.D. in criminology from the University of Cambridge and afterwards was a Junior Research Fellow at Christ Church College, University of Oxford. He won the European Society of Criminology's Young Criminologist Award in 2007 and the 2009 British Society of Criminology Book Prize for his first book, *When Children Kill Children: Penal Populism and Political Culture* (2008, Oxford University Press). He is one of nine Thematic Fellows selected to study "questions of punishment" at the Straus Institute for the Advanced Study of Law & Justice at New York University Law School. While there, Green is researching a new book tentatively titled, *Selling Redemption: The Second Chance Act and American Penal Culture*. He, along with Maria Hartwig, recently received a DHS grant of \$400,000 to fund two PhD students for three years. Green's grant project will focus on issues related to mass-mediated terrorism. His broader research interests center on the intersection of crime, media, public opinion, and politics in a comparative perspective.
