#### F. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURE

Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:

When the Criminal Justice Associate of Arts program or general education requirements at Borough of Manhattan Community College or the International Criminal Justice Bachelor of Arts program or general education requirements at John Jay College of Criminal Justice undergo any changes relevant to this agreement, this articulation agreement will be reviewed and revised as necessary by one or two faculty members of each institution's department or program.

At the end of each academic year, the various representatives of each institution as indicated above will review the performance of transfer students to determine if adjustment to, or termination of the articulation agreement, is needed.

This articulation agreement will be publicized on both the Borough of Manhattan Community College and JJC websites. Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students. The faculty representative from JJC's B.A. in International Criminal Justice will arrange an annual information session with the BMCC campus for interested students.
